About Us

The Gleneayre Equestrian Program was established in 1998 by Bob and Ellen Healey. The GEP mission is to provide a hands-on, experience-based learning environment for people in difficult situations, including children, families, and military personnel.

We focus on a population that is poorly served by more mainstream resources and programs and believe that the powerful connection between people and horses can be transformational. Through horsemanship, we develop character, teach ethics, and encourage physical and emotional growth. The GEP provides Equine Facilitated Learning and a unique Working Student Program which bring children and horses together for the betterment of each other's lives.

The GEP also provides a safe haven for the donated program horses to live with dignity, peace, and veterinary care to achieve the best quality of life. Donated horses are accepted into the Working Student Program, and when they can no longer be ridden, they become equine facilitators in our non-riding activities.

We use the powerful connection between horses and people to teach, learn, grow, and heal. We provide a safe haven for our program horses to live with dignity, peace, and veterinary care to achieve the best quality of life.

The Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA) is a national 501(c)3 dedicated to introducing and promoting lifelong involvement in equestrian athletics. It affords all participants access to clinics, college recruitment events, mentorships, volunteer opportunities, contests, and more. Students can also list their involvement in IEA on their college applications and resumes while building leadership skills that will benefit them in future pursuits.

GEP Promotes Environmental Sustainability





The GEP working students won the **Green is the New Blue's Summer Jump Contest** which encouraged riders to use natural resources local to their farm to create a living jump. Working together, the students foraged for grasses, flowers, stray logs and branches from the recent summer storm, and fresh pine needles. Viewers voted for the best submission and our students were selected as winners, receiving Green is the New Blue ribbons and making memories in the process.








Making Strides for a More Sustainable Sport

New Equine Science Saturday Program




We are excited to have begun offering classes in our brand-new classroom! Our team converted a storage area into a beautiful learning space with tables and chairs where students can gather, have lunch together, and participate in various learning opportunities including our new Equine Science Program. In this program, students meet once a month to receive guided, hands-on lessons in Equine Science.



Equine Science Curriculum and Benefits

The equine science curriculum combines equine care and equine science with topics that range from proper grooming techniques and equine nutrition to exploring the biology and physiology of horses. By engaging children in hands-on activities and educational experiences centered around horses, we are able to promote character development, responsibility, and a passion for animals. This program also provides practical life skills related to animal care and teamwork and encourages a potential career interest in animal-related fields, including veterinary science and equine management.

Hamel Family Foundation Donates Scholarship Fund for GEP Alumni



The Hamel Family Foundation, an organization dedicated to "supporting the education and well-being of disadvantaged children and their families through scholarship opportunities and extracurricular programs", provided a **scholarship fund** to be awarded to **Working Student alumni seeking further education**. This year the scholarship was awarded to two alumni who are currently attending college, one of which is pursuing a degree in Animal and Veterinary Science from Tuskegee University!

Welcoming Kelley Spiegel to the Gleneayre Team





We are excited to welcome Kelley Spiegel to the Gleneayre Team. Kelley comes with over 12 years of experience working as a School Psychologist as well as serving as a chairperson for her fellow Child Study Team for over 5 years. She holds her Masters and Educational Specialist Degree in School Psychology, as well as her Supervisor's Certification and Principal Certification eligibility in School Administration. With Kelley's expertise, we were able to **update our Equine Facilitated Learning Program curriculum to be compliant with New Jersey's Learning Standards** and connect with more schools and after-school programs that could benefit from our services.

Making an Impact with Brookfield Students



In 2024 we joined Jessica Ramsden, Brookfield's lead therapist, in two semesters of Equine Facilitated Learning, one in the spring and one in the fall. Each Brookfield student received 20 hours of guided equine-assisted sessions over 10 classes and together we were able to help 17 students across Brookfield Schools and Brookfield Academy. Students who struggle in classroom settings were able to reinforce skills learned in school with our hands-on equine-assisted program.



Equine Facilitated Learning Horse Ramblin' Rose Wins EQUUS Horse of the Year Award





Ramblin' Rose, one of our many incredible program horses, was selected as this year's **2024 Horse Star Hall of Fame Inductee by EQUUS Foundation** which honors "horses who have had an inspirational impact on the public as companions, teachers, and healers". Rosie was rescued from the streets of Philadelphia before being picked up by Last Chance Ranch then brought home to Gleneayre. With time and a lot of love, Rosie became more confident and went on to excel at shows, even winning the 2015 Courses by Design Horse Show series Grand Championship in English Pleasure! Then, in 2021, she had an accident in the pasture which led her to finding her next calling.

While she was recovering from her injury, Rosie was utilized in our **Equine Facilitated Learning** classes and it was here that she found her true calling. She was able to make profound connections with participants who were more reserved or shut down, bringing them out of their shell with her comforting presence and kind eyes and helping them on their path to wellness. She truly is a GEP superstar and living proof that love, and kindness can heal all.



Annual 2024 EQUUS Guardian Award

The Gleneayre Equestrian Program is proud to announce that we have once again been awarded the status of **EQUUS Foundation Guardian** for 2024. Guardianship is awarded to equine charities on the Equine Welfare Network that demonstrate a commitment to public transparency about their programs, horse care practices, and governance available for public scrutiny. Through this program we were also awarded \$2,500 toward our programs and equine care.

Gleneayre Partners with Project Refit and NJ Soldier and Family Readiness Group for Farm Retreat





This year, Gleneayre partnered with **Project Refit** to provide a safe and private location to host a "Summer Retreat on the Farm" which **serviced 27 members of the NJ Soldier and Family Readiness Group (SFRG)**. This retreat provided the opportunity for members to meet and receive valuable support in person, as their meetings are often limited to virtual meetings or phone calls.



During the retreat, the Project Refit team facilitated support groups that offered guidance to **spouses and family members of active-duty military members on their first deployment**.

During that time experienced GEP staff, with the help of 10 volunteers from the local community, provided an educational, non-riding, hands-on activity for the children of the SFRG members while the parents/family members attended the support groups.

The event was a great success, and we are excited to be able to provide the healing power of horses to support active-duty military members and their families as they proudly serve our country.








New Veteran Equine Program Provides Local Veterans with Weekly Equine Gatherings



In 2024, the GEP engaged local military and veterans' groups to develop the Veterans Equine Program. Our successful pilot welcomed local veterans for a 6-week interactive horse experience. Veterans met every Friday morning for coffee, donuts, socializing, peer support, and guided, hands-on interaction with horses, led by GEP's experienced staff. **This program was provided at no cost to service members** and **served 10 veterans this year**. Through the partnership and support of local veteran programs, we plan to continue to develop our existing program curriculum to effectively bring the benefits of the human-horse connection to more populations within the military community.



The Healing Impact of the Horse Human Connection

Horses provide immediate nonverbal feedback, detecting and reflecting the emotions of those around them. Equine activities offer ways to understand one's own emotions and behaviors. The horse-human connection developed in our programs has proven to help participants reconnect **emotionally**, **socially**, and **physically** with themselves and others. It also provides various positive therapeutic effects, including enhanced well-being, stress reduction, relaxation, and relationship building.






Putting the "Fun" in Fundraising
